The Autism Center of Nebraska is proud to announce Charles V. Sederstrom, Jr., as the distinguished recipient of the [John T. Clark Award](#). This award recognizes Mr. Sederstrom's extraordinary service to improving the health and lives of people with disabilities in Nebraska.

Mr. Sederstrom is known for his legal expertise in health law as well as his extensive service to over fifty boards and civic organizations. He has won many awards in recognition of his service to others, his volunteerism, his health law practice, and his humanitarianism.

Mr. Sederstrom began practicing law in Omaha, Nebraska, in 1968, with a focus on corporate law and health law. He served the largest nongovernmental employer and the largest hospital in Nebraska, Alegend Creighton Health. In addition to his service to Autism Center of Nebraska as a member of the Board of Directors, his civic affiliations include Omaha Home for Boys, United Way of the Midlands, The Salvation Army, and American Diabetes Association.

His work with ACN began in 2012, when he joined the Board of Directors. For twelve years, through the end of his term in 2024, Mr. Sederstrom brought his incredible depth and breadth of experience to the board, not only from his legal expertise in health law, but also from his prodigious experience with board service and volunteer work with nonprofits in the health and social services sector. This perspective helped ACN expand its geographic footprint, maintain exemplary standing with governmental agencies, and uphold high standards of governance and oversight.

This award, which is named after the late John T. Clark, who served on the ACN Board of Directors with Mr. Sederstrom, was celebrated at [ACN's 2026 Hats Off Gala](#), which was held Saturday, April 25, 2026, at 5:00 p.m.

The award was presented by the 2025 winner of the John T. Clark Award, Rene Ferdinand, to Chuck Sederstrom III, who received the award on behalf of his father.
